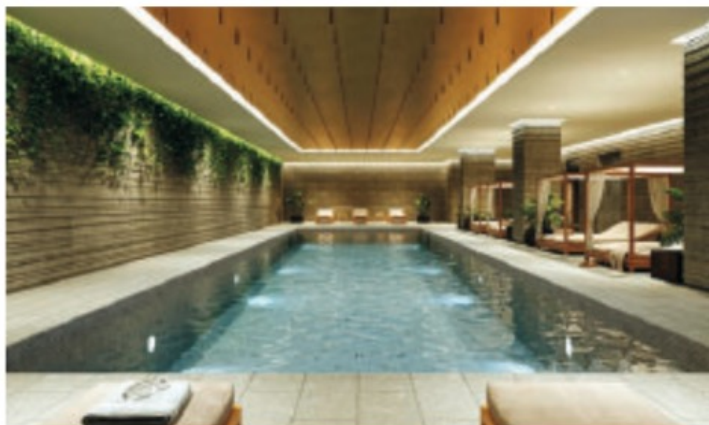

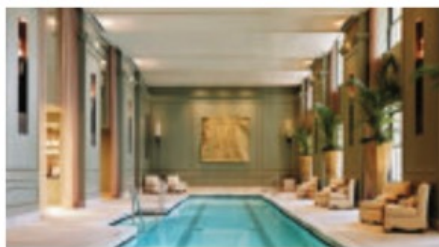
#### The Strand, Turks and Caicos

If you'd rather stay in a place that has pool weather year-round, look no further than this oceanfront home at The Strand, a new private residential community on Cooper Jack Bay in Providenciales. This expansive property, which includes a five-bedroom main house and a one-bedroom guesthouse, offers plenty of ways to enjoy the outdoors: private access to a grotto beach; a courtyard with a plunge pool, spa, and outdoor kitchen; and a formal terrace with an infinity pool. *Grand Residence R-4, The Strand, Providenciales, Turks and Caicos; 7,312 square feet, 6 bedrooms, 6.5 bathrooms; \$10.5 million, thestrandtci.com*

The list of status amenities at New York City residences keeps growing—from pickleball courts to movie theaters and music rooms—but the feature that makes the biggest splash remains the indoor pool.

On Billionaire's Row, residents at the toothpick-skinny **111 West 57th Street** can perfect their butterfly stroke in an 82-foot lap pool that's set beneath a double-height vaulted ceiling, then continue on to soak in their own condo's antique-polished freestanding tub, custom-designed by the British brand William Holland. (Looking for an entire floor high in the sky? Residence 66 will set you back \$25.5 million.)

The new **Maverick Chelsea**, meanwhile, has three floors of indoor and outdoor amenities, anchored by a 60-foot pool. The surrounding space, with a wall of trailing ivy and a warm, bronze glow, is a calming oasis, and the accompanying sauna and Himalayan salt-walled meditation room amplify the serenity. A handful of residential



units are available, including the two-bedroom 9C for \$2.5 million.

**One Manhattan Square** isn't messing around when it comes to pools, either. The property boasts a 75-foot saltwater pool, a children's wading pool, a plunge pool, and a hot tub. The complex even celebrates water you might not want to swim in: The floor-to-ceiling windows in the three-bedroom 59A (\$3.67 million) reveal gorgeous East River views.

Across the river at **Brooklyn Point**, you can stay fit by doing laps in the 65-foot saltwater pool. Things get even better in the summer, when you can take a dip in the highest residential infinity pool in the Western Hemisphere.



### THE UPGRADE

#### Marimekko Iso Noppa Robe

Everyone should follow certain dictates of post-pool elevator etiquette—namely, don't ride back to your floor dripping wet and wrapped in a towel. This cotton terry Marimekko robe, with a graphic dice-check print by Finnish textile designer Vuokko Eskolin-Nurmesniemi, is so chic you could even wear it down to the lobby to pick up your mail. *\$235, marimekko.com*
